SUBJECT: Celebrating a powerful 14th year featuring Bridgeway's vision: A World without Genocide!

We thank the Dallas County
Community College District for
hosting our opening session, "A
Catalyst for Global Hope &
Reconciliation". We were honored
to welcome Mike Mulcahy,
President and COO of Bridgeway
Capital Management and Shannon
Sedgwick Davis, CEO of Bridgeway
Foundation, a passionate advocate
for social justice and International
human rights.





Mike opened with a challenge. Recent research indicates on average 30% of Employees are engaged in the workplace, 50% are unengaged and 20% are disengaged. This means 70% are uninspired by their work and just showing up. How can we create meaningful work that captures the best of the human spirit?

He then shared the Vision and Higher Purpose of Bridgeway – A world without genocide.

and world change and then began sharing their story of amazingly bold ways they are making a difference.

- We give away 50% of our profits and engage every staff member in giving.
- We have chosen a 7 to 1 total compensation cap to build a more equitable work environment.
- We believe and invest in Servant Leadership across the company.
- We value our staff members by maintaining flexible work hours, engaging the family, and building long-term relationships.
- We value and pursue integrity. For example, for years we were reimbursing investors in one of our funds for a period of poor performance. Most industry players would have closed their fund but we felt we owed this to our investors.
- Leveraging this desire to change the approach to business by modeling it for other companies.

Shannon spoke of the courageous strategies to end genocide by investing in radio towers so villages could warn each other of LRA attacks and reported violence being down by 93% over the past two years and abductions down by 67%. These are clearly encouraging signs!

We were all tremendously inspired as we heard this amazing story of extraordinary generosity and higher purpose, not to mention putting one's life on the line in the cause of social justice.



Each member organization received four copies of the new book, *Conscious Capitalism: Liberating the Heroic Spirit of Business*, which will be our inspiring resource for all three sessions this year. The first tenet, Higher Purpose will take the concepts Mike and Shannon introduced even further and help to better understand higher purpose within an organization, on an individual level, and how the two can coexist. We encourage you to take some time to read through Part One and share any insights with your team.
