Beginning its sixth year, Southern Methodist University's Experimental Arts Program will be developing new dimensions focused on innovations with youth in museum education, an enriched arts program for inner-city youth developed cooperatively with the Dallas Independent School District and North Texas State University, and an extended program of national travel, visitation from other major arts educators and information sharing which will contribute to the development of all aspects of SMU's program.

Helping youngsters discover and learn to use their own unique creative qualities through the visual arts, theatre, music, film, creative writing and dance is one of the goals of the Experimental Arts Program. New ideas and innovations are introduced each semester so that a curriculum is never repeated. Since each student is individually taught, he or she can continue to work and experience new growth.

EAP would like to invite and encourage parents to attend any two class sessions. Children should be dressed for active learning in washable clothes. Motivations at the beginning of each class are the basis for the activities that follow, so prompt arrival to all classes is important.

All classes will meet in the Owen Arts Center on the SMU campus. Each class size is limited to insure a low student-teacher ratio. Tuition for all the children's classes will be \$50 unless noted otherwise in the schedule. Materials and supplies will be furnished. A deposit will reserve registration in any class, the balance to be paid on the first day of class. No refunds will be made after the first day of class.

Receipt of registration form with deposit constitutes enrollment. If a class is filled, notification will be given and the deposit returned. NO FURTHER NOTIFICATION WILL BE MADE TO STUDENTS ENROLLED IN A CLASS.
